GETTING STARTED

This product is compatible with Game Boy Color systems only.

- 1- Make sure the power switch of your Game Boy Color is OFF.
- 2- Insert the Boarder Zone Game Pak as described in your Game Boy Color instruction manual.
- 3- Move the power switch to the ON position.

CONTROLLING THE MENU SYSTEM

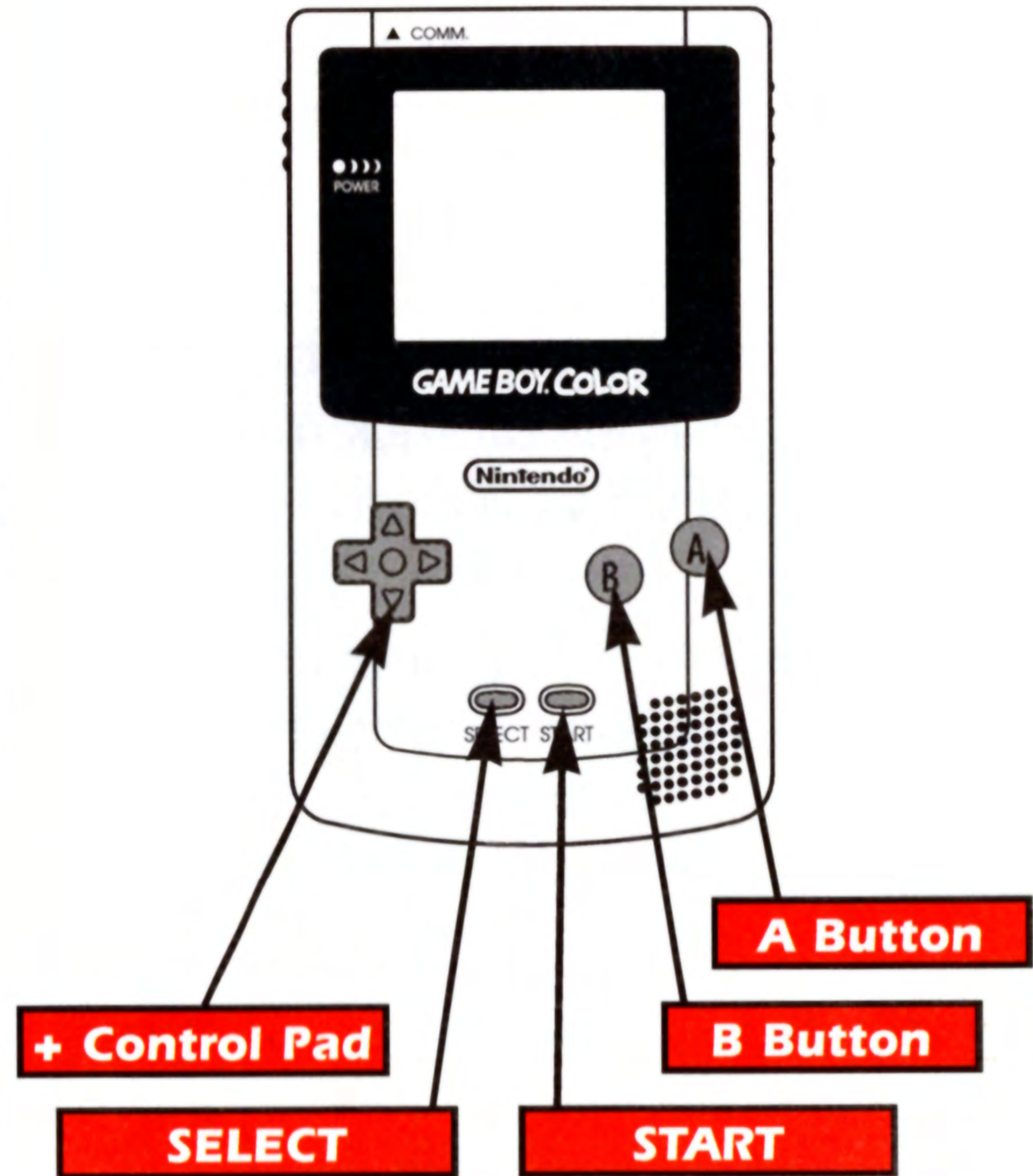
The menu system in Boarder Zone is designed to be simple to use.

Before playing the game you will move through several menu screens where you will select which game you'll play, which character you'll use and also be able to configure various options.

Use the controls below to navigate through the menus:

- Use **+ CONTROL PAD** to highlight different options.
- Use the **A BUTTON** to make your selection.
- If you make a mistake or change your mind, press the **B BUTTON** to return to the previous screen.

- **START** will move you to the next screen when appropriate.



GAME MODES

COMPETITION

This mode allows you to compete against computer-controlled snowboarders in a variety of different races.

RACE ATTACK

Race against another snowboarder. You can try to pull off trick moves, but grabbing sky slows you down!

TRICK ATTACK

Enter a five-course competition. You must score a certain number of points (or more) to advance to the next course.

TIME ATTACK

Participate in a competition on three downhill tracks. You're looking for the

fastest time, so race down the tracks as fast as you dare!

BOARDER ZONE

Amass points over five different events by pulling off tricks and stomping your landing.

CHALLENGE

This mode challenges you to beat previous records that have been set on any of the currently available courses. You may select a Time, Trick or Slalom Attack course. Your goal is to ride better and beat the high score or fastest time for that course.

TIME ATTACK

Complete the course in the fastest time possible.

TRICK ATTACK

Do as many different tricks as possible while still finishing the course in the allotted time.

SLALOM ATTACK

Once again, do a variety of tricks and finish the course within the time limit. You get more time for each flag you successfully negotiate.

PRACTICE

Practice mode allows you to hone your skills while the game shows you the moves. You will start on the practice track with no time limit. You are given the option to continue at the bottom of the track.

SPECIAL FEATURES

RACE GHOST

The Race Ghost is a special feature available in the Challenge Mode that allows you to race against "yourself". You can record your own movements in the game and subsequently race against a "Ghost" character, who will follow this recording to re-create your actions. This is a feature that can be used for fun racing or to help improve your downhill boarding technique.

OPTIONS

You may change default configurations through the options menu:

MUSIC
This can be switched ON or OFF

SOUND EFFECT
This can be switched ON or OFF

VIEW HIGH SCORES
Shows you all the high scores.

VIEW CREDITS
Select this option to see who created this game.

PASSWORDS

Boarder Zone has its secrets. As you play the game, you'll discover hidden features, but we're not going to tell you what they are. It's up to you to find them.

Once they are unlocked, you will be given passwords so you can easily unlock them again at a later date.

CONTROLS

Use these keys to control your Snowboarder:

+ CONTROL PAD ◀ and ▶

Carve (steer) the board left or right.

+ CONTROL PAD ▲

Increase your speed.

+ CONTROL PAD ▼

Decrease your speed by braking.

A BUTTON

Jump. Use this to avoid obstacles or attempt a more advanced trick. You can use some objects as ramps to make your jumps higher.

B BUTTON

Your Snowboarder will grab and hold the 'board if airborne. This is the simplest trick.

PAUSE

Pause the game at any time during play by pressing START.

ADVANCED MOVES

You can make your Snowboarder perform more advanced tricks while airborne by using "combo" type control maneuvers.

The "+" symbol in these tables means that you need to hold multiple buttons down in order to perform the trick.

For instance "**B + ▲**" means that you should press the **B BUTTON** and **+ CONTROL PAD ▲** at the same time in order to perform a "Nose Grab" trick.

The comma (",") is used to indicate a sequence of button hits or combinations. "**A, B**" means press the **A BUTTON** and then the **B BUTTON**.

REMEMBER:

You can only perform these tricks while in the air. Grab some sky by jumping, as described in the Controls section.

You also need to jump to perform these harder moves, but don't forget you can use a snow ramp or other objects to gain extra height.

INTRODUCING THE SNOWBOARDERS

In Boarder Zone, you compete as one of four experienced snowboarders. They all have different abilities:

SPEED

This is the maximum speed the snowboarder can travel at.

BALANCE

This rating determines how fast the snowboarder recovers when landing or after hitting an object.

JUMPING

This is a measurement of the character's jumping ability.

Consider a character with the best abilities suited to your challenge when you are going after new records!

SANDY



Sandy spends her weekends in the Canadian back country, practicing her moves. Her time on her school's

gymnastics team

combines perfectly with her love for snowboarding.

She has a super sleek riding style and gets lots of air!
