



Getting Started


1. Set up your PlayStation according to the instruction manual.
2. Insert the “Italian Job™” DISC and close the disc cover.
3. Turn the PlayStation ON at the POWER button.

NOTE: It is advised that you do not insert or remove peripherals or MEMORY CARDS once the power is turned on, so if you wish to save your game, ensure there is 1 free block on your MEMORY CARD before commencing play.





Controlling Your Car



DUALSHOCK® Analog Controller Support

The vibration function can be toggled on or off in the Controller Setup section of the OPTIONS menu.

Menu Controls

On all of the menu and selection screens you can use LEFT and RIGHT on the directional button to highlight your choice, then press the X button to verify its selection. If you press the A button at any time you will be returned to the previous menu.



Main Menu

By pressing LEFT or RIGHT on the directional button you can highlight any of the seven menu items:

ITALIAN JOB MODE: This is the main game story mode.

PARTY PLAY: Select this to play in a series of car trials with up to seven friends.

OPTIONS: This will allow you to adjust the game's setup.

CHALLENGE MODE: Unlock this mode to test your single player driving skills.

FREE RIDE: Want to drive around London and Turin, taking in the sights at your leisure? Then try this mode.

CHECKPOINT MODE: Scream around the streets of London and Turin in the ultimate test of slalom skill.

DESTRUCTOR MODE: Are you a Cone Killer? Chase down all of the road cones before the time runs out.

Italian Job Mode

Italian Job Mode is where you get to play the part of lovable rogue Charlie Croker and his gang as they get together all of the people and equipment they need to pull off a raid as daring as the Italian Job. As you work your way through the game, from London to Turin and finally to the Alps, you will open up new cars for you to drive in Free Ride Mode and new trials for you to conquer in Challenge Mode, Checkpoint Mode and Destructor Mode.




Choosing Your Mission

To play "The Italian Job" mode you must first select one of the missions from this screen. The screen shows the three sections of the game: London, Turin and The Alps.

The first time you come to this screen only one of the missions will be unlocked for you to play, the rest are marked with an enigmatic . Press LEFT and RIGHT on the directional button to move between the available missions to play and then press the button to confirm your choice. As you complete each mission, more will be unlocked and become accessible through this screen. As each mission is unlocked more Checkpoint races, Destructor races and Challenges also become available, so keep a lookout in the other menus. Remember that, as you make your way through the game, the only way to save your progress is to ensure that before you turn on your PlayStation you have a MEMORY CARD inserted into MEMORY CARD slot 1 or MEMORY CARD slot 2 with at least 1 free block available.

The Briefing Screen

Once you have selected which part of The Italian Job you want to play, you will be taken to the secret conference room where you'll be briefed by top dog Charlie Croker. Listen carefully to what Charlie has to say, he's a smart guy and it could mean the difference between getting that \$4,000,000 in gold bullion or ending up being served spaghetti by a man named Antonio every day for a ten year stretch.



You can skip the briefing screen at any time by pressing the **X** button.

Playing the game

To complete The Italian Job, you will have to drive many different vehicles and take part in a huge variety of missions ranging from picking up your gangland benefactor's right hand man to transporting explosives in a particularly rickety old coach. Sometimes you'll have to stick to the rules of the road and sometimes you'll have to use every trick in the book to evade the Police.

One thing you'll have to remember is that every collision damages your car and adds to your damage meter (found at the top left hand corner of the screen). Should your damage meter fill up, your car will be wrecked and your chances of pulling off The Italian Job will be ruined.

Finding your way around

Navigating your way around big cities like London and Turin can be a real challenge. Fortunately much of the time during gameplay you'll be pointed in the right direction by the very helpful Italian Job Arrow. However, if you want to find all of the sneaky shortcuts and quickest routes through the bustling metropolises you really want to carefully study the maps printed at the back of the manual.

Law and disorder

Life's not fair, and taking part in the Italian Job will sometimes bring you to the attention of the police. When they give chase, you will hear the sirens behind you and see the speedo flashing at the bottom of the screen; the bigger the triangle, the closer they are. If the Police get too close they'll read your number plate and once they get the whole thing then the game is over.

The Mafia

The Mafia, on the other hand, generally don't abide by the law. If you encounter these creeps in Turin they will do their best to ram you off the road and send you packing back to England.

NOTE: You may pause the game, return to the main menu, retry the current mission or refresh your memory with the current objectives simply by pressing the START button at any time during gameplay. Pressing the START button again will return you to the game.

Party Play Mode

Party Play Mode lets up to seven people take part in a competition to determine just who is the king of the road. Once you have selected Party Play Mode from the main menu you will be asked to select the number of players who will take part in the Party Play challenge.



Press LEFT and RIGHT on the directional button to select the number of players and then press the \times button to confirm your choice. Now use the same method to select the number of games you wish to play.

Once you have selected the number of games to play, you will be presented with a bar on the screen. The bar contains icons representing all of the Challenge, Checkpoint and Destructor games available in Party Play mode. Navigate the different game icons by pressing LEFT and RIGHT on the directional button and move between Challenge, Checkpoint and Destructor modes by pressing UP and DOWN on the directional button. When you have found the game you want to play just press the \times button and the icon will be transferred into your customized game bar in the middle of the screen. By using this method you can pick and choose up to ten different Challenge, Checkpoint or Destructor games for you and your friends to play.

Options

Adjust Screen Position

Use UP, DOWN, LEFT and RIGHT on the directional button to adjust the position of the display on your screen. Press the \times button to confirm the changes, or press the \triangle button to return to the previous menu.

Controller Setup

There are three different Controller layout options in the

Italian Job. To change the Controller layout from the default, press LEFT or RIGHT on the directional button so that the selection 'LAYOUT' appears in the menu bar at the bottom left hand corner of the screen, then press the \times button. Pressing LEFT or RIGHT on the directional button will now change the layout, while pressing the \times button will confirm the new Controller settings.

If you have a DUALSHOCK® analog controller then you can toggle the vibration function On and Off by pressing LEFT or RIGHT on the directional button so that the selection 'VIBRATION' appears in menu bar at the bottom left hand corner of the screen and then pressing the \times button. Now press LEFT or RIGHT on the directional button to move between ON and OFF, and press the \times button to select your new setting.

The NeGcon® controller is supported by The Italian Job. You can calibrate this device by entering the Controller Setup menu and following the on-screen instructions. Steering wheels with a NeGcon® compatible playing mode can also be calibrated in this menu; however, after playing each level you must return the Wheel to NeGcon® mode. Please refer to your Steering Wheel manual for instructions on how to do this.

Difficulty Mode

There are two difficulty modes in The Italian Job. Choose this option and then press LEFT or RIGHT on the directional button so that the selections "Easy" or "Normal"

appear in the menu bar at the bottom left hand corner of the screen, then press the  button to confirm your choice.

Save

You can save your progress at any time in the game by returning to the main menu (you can do this by pressing the  button while you are in the mission select screen or by pressing the START button during gameplay to bring up the Pause menu, then select the QUIT option) and selecting OPTIONS and then SAVE.

You will be presented with a picture of two MEMORY CARDS. The picture of the MEMORY CARD on the left of the screen represents the MEMORY CARD in MEMORY CARD slot 1, while the picture of the MEMORY CARD on the right of the screen represents the MEMORY CARD in MEMORY CARD slot 2. If the MEMORY CARD has an X symbol over it, this means there is no valid MEMORY CARD in that particular MEMORY CARD slot.

You may highlight a MEMORY CARD for use by using LEFT and RIGHT on the directional button. Pressing the  button will start the saving process. Now follow the on-screen prompts to save your game.

NOTE: Before powering on your PlayStation, you must have inserted a MEMORY CARD in MEMORY CARD slot 1 or MEMORY CARD slot 2 with at least 1 free block on it in order for this facility to function correctly.

Load

Select the OPTIONS menu and then the LOAD menu. You will be presented with a picture of two MEMORY CARDS; The picture of the MEMORY CARD on the left of the screen represents the MEMORY CARD in MEMORY CARD slot 1, the picture of the MEMORY CARD on the right of the screen represents the MEMORY CARD in MEMORY CARD slot 2. If the MEMORY CARD has an X symbol over it, this means there is no valid MEMORY CARD or valid save game in that particular MEMORY CARD slot.

You may highlight a valid MEMORY CARD for use by

using LEFT and RIGHT on the directional button. Pressing the  button will instigate the loading procedure.

Now follow the on-screen prompts to load your game.

NOTE: Before powering on your PlayStation, you must have inserted a MEMORY CARD in MEMORY CARD slot 1 or MEMORY CARD slot 2 with a valid Italian Job saved game on it in order for this facility to function correctly.

Audio Setup

When you select this option you will see two dials on the Audio Setup screen. These represent SOUND EFFECTS volume and MUSIC volume. You can move between the two dials by pressing UP and DOWN on the directional button, and change the volume by pressing LEFT or RIGHT on the directional button.

NOTE: You can also change the volume of sound effects and music at any time during the game by pressing the START button and moving the highlight down to SFX VOLUME or MUSIC VOLUME. Pressing LEFT or RIGHT on the directional button will then alter the volume setting.

Challenge Mode

Challenge Mode consists of ten tough trials of driving skill, speed and courage. There are exercises in jumping, racing and car control. As you work your way through the Italian Job Mode the Challenge Mode will become unlocked.

Choosing the Game Mode

Press LEFT or RIGHT on the directional button to select one of the ten challenges, then press the  button to begin the game.

Playing Challenge Mode

Before you start, you will be given instructions on the nature of the challenge and exactly what you need to do in order to win.



If you wish, at any time during the challenge you may restart by pressing the START button and selecting RETRY from the Pause menu.

Free Ride

Free Ride mode gives you the opportunity to drive around the beautiful city environments of London and Turin.



As you drive around you'll meet some colorful characters who may offer you a challenge. Have fun and drive safely!

NOTE: When you first play Free Ride Mode, only one vehicle and the London map are unlocked. However, as you complete missions in Italian Job Mode, more cars and eventually the Turin map will be unlocked.



Select Vehicle

Pressing LEFT or RIGHT on the directional button will cycle between all of the cars available. Press the **X** button to select the currently displayed car and you can then move on to selecting your city.

Select City

Change between the London and Turin maps by pressing LEFT or RIGHT on the directional button. Pressing the **X** button will select the currently displayed city and launch you into the game.

Checkpoint Mode

Checkpoint Mode is a crazy slalom race through city streets, Italian Job style.

Selecting a Checkpoint Race

Although 19 of the races are initially unavailable, once unlocked you can press LEFT or RIGHT on the directional button and select from any of the twenty challenges, then press the **X** button to begin the game.

Playing Checkpoint Mode

Before you start you will be given instructions on the nature of the challenge and exactly what you need to do in order to win.

If you wish, at any time during the challenge, you may restart by pressing the START button and selecting RETRY from the Pause menu.

Destructor Mode

Ever wanted to mow down those lines of cones bordering all road works? Well, Destructor Mode is a dream come true. Lines of cones snake through the city streets, just begging you to come and show them your front bumper.



Selecting a Destructor Race

Although 19 of the races are initially unavailable, once unlocked you can press LEFT or RIGHT on the directional button and select from any of the twenty challenges, then press the **X** button to begin the game.

Playing Destructor Mode

Before you start you will be given instructions on the nature of the challenge and exactly what you need to do in order to win. If you wish, at any time during the challenge, you may restart by pressing the START button and selecting RETRY from the Pause menu.

Hints And Tips

STUDY THE CITY MAPS CAREFULLY – they'll show you all of the short cuts you can use to trim valuable seconds off your mission times.

PRACTICE IN FREE RIDE MODE. There is no time limit here so you can spend hours admiring the scenery and developing tactics for each mission.

In London cars drive on the left, in Turin they drive on the right. Remember to stick to the correct side of the road and avoid on-coming traffic.

ALTERNATIVE ROUTES. Try alternative routes to avoid Police or Mafia cars.

LINE UP YOUR CAR BEFORE ATTEMPTING ANY JUMPS – only an expert turns while jumping - though this skill may be useful later in the game.

CORNERS. Take as many corners as possible to lose the Police or the Mafia.

THE SHORTEST ROUTE – is not necessarily the best route.




